

IN MEMORY OF WALTER C. BLACK, C. STANLEY STULTS & NETTIE BLACK STULTS

On these grounds once were the nurseries of Walter C. Black. Mr. Black was an avid athlete and golfer who many times shot his age here at Peddie. At age 94 he was the oldest tax collector in the Country. He also served as a public school board member for over 54 years and was Treasurer of Peddie School for 31 years. His daughter, Nettie, married C. Stanley Stults, who, with a few other local businessmen, built the original 9 hole course. During the late 1920s they gave the course to Peddie School who expanded it to 18 holes in the early 1950s. The Black house was located between the two entrances and the original clubhouse was located next to the current 8th tee.

This addition built in 1984 and the 1997 improvements were made possible due to the contributions and encouragement of Charlie, Walter and Cappy Stults, Allen & Stults Co. and the Peddie School who desired to recognize the above family members whose lives inspired love of community, education, the outdoors, the value of sportsmanship and this great game of golf.
